47 homes - 10 locations - Serving 470 elders Construction underway to serve an additional 90 elders!



The Green House® Project (GHP) is excited to announce that <u>Otterbein SeniorLife</u>'s 47 small house skilled nursing and rehab homes have recently become designated as Green House homes. **Constant Contact**

Established in 1912, Lebanon, Ohio-based Otterbein is a nonprofit organization that offers independent living, assisted living, skilled nursing, rehab, memory support, respite care, home health care, and hospice services among its 20 locations throughout Ohio, and in Franklin, Ind.



The first of Otterbein's small house homes was

opened in 2007 in Marblehead, Ohio. They have since grown to 47 homes in 10 locations, and currently serve up to 470 elders. Construction is underway to increase capacity to serve an additional 90 elders by the end of 2021.

New Green House Video Illustrates Our Journey Amid the Pandemic

Just a few months into the pandemic, it became apparent that Green House homes were faring better than traditional nursing homes. When the University of North Carolina partnered with Green House to collect and analyze data, the picture became clearer and more obvious--Green House was made for this moment.

A Special Visit During the Pandemic

Staying in Summit is a grass roots coalition made up of volunteers who are working to bring housing and care communities to Summit County, Colo., so that elders and adults with disabilities can age in place. Currently, residents must leave the county to access health care services.

In early February several board members accompanied by County Commissioner Elizabeth Lawrence toured the Green House Homes at Mirasol in Loveland. Pam Piper, advisory board member stated, "the conditions are ripe for this project."

This project will be a partnership between the community and the county, which has agreed to gift the land for the project. Currently they are raising money and focusing on increasing community awareness of their vision. They are accepting proposals for an RFP and hope to award the contract soon.
