# The Sage: A Key Role in the Green House Model

You may ask, what is a Sage and why do I need one? From the beginning, when The Green House Project was in early development, there has always been a role for a volunteer to support the Shahbazim as they form into a self-managed team – The Sage.

One of the core values of the Green House philosophy is "empowered staff." The main responsibility of Sages is to support the Shahbazim. Their role is to serve as advisor, facilitator, coach, and role model to

the Shahbazim as they form "a self-managed team." By creating a valued relationship with the Shahbazim, the Sage becomes a trusted person to whom the Shahbazim seek counsel and assistance with problem solving. The Sage works closely with the Guide. In addition, Sages act as liaisons between Shahbazim and Elders, and with the administration team as needed.

The pandemic has made it challenging for the Sages to support the homes. As your homes have an opportunity to vaccinate elders and staff, we encourage you to include Sages. They are important members of your team and are eager to resume their support roles in the homes.

## Jewish Senior Life: A Unique Partnership with an Amish Community to Solve a PPE Issue

At Green House we often say "It's all about relationships" and that certainly was the case for *Jewish Senior Life* (JSL) in Rochester, NY when finding PPE early in the pandemic was difficult to acquire and extremely costly. How was the situation remedied? An Amish community agreed to sew reusable cloth PPE isolation gowns – roughly 10,000 over several weeks.

It's a story of creativity and relationships. In need of PPE, the JSL team wondered if the local Amish community might be able to help. JSL Chief Information Officer & VP of Information Technology, Travis Masonis, asked his father who runs a produce stand during the spring and summer in Pike, NY and has forged

relationships with the Amish community if he could make the request.



Travis's dad reached out to Moes, the general store manager for the Amish and he spread the word to find women willing to sew the gowns in their homes. Twenty women agreed to sew following a pattern created by Travis. The women sewed small, medium, and large gowns on pedal operated sewing machines, since there is no electricity in the Amish community.

Mike King, CEO of JSL, drove each Friday to pick up the completed gowns. Due to very low COVID cases and deaths at JSL, they did not need all the gowns. As a member of a New York non-profit alliance with five other nursing homes, JSL was able share the gowns with the other homes dealing with larger coronavirus outbreaks.

We applaud the efforts and hard work by the local Amish community and the creative approaches to meet a practical need at JSL and within their nursing home alliance!




