### We Want Your Photos!!



### **New ECHO Serves Arkansas Nursing Homes**

GHP recently launched an initiative with Project ECHO via the <u>Agency for Healthcare Research</u> and <u>Quality (AHRQ) ECHO National Nursing Home COVID-19 Action Network (CAN)</u>.

This is the third initiative that GHP has implemented with Project ECHO.

The CAN initiative provides free training and mentorship to nursing homes across the country to increase the implementation of evidence-based infection prevention and safety practices to protect



residents and staff. It is being offered to Arkansas nursing homes in partnership with Angela Norman, director of the Centers on Aging at the University of Arkansas.
